They are inspiring in their quest for lifelong learning and research, and open up new vistas for their respective fields of study.

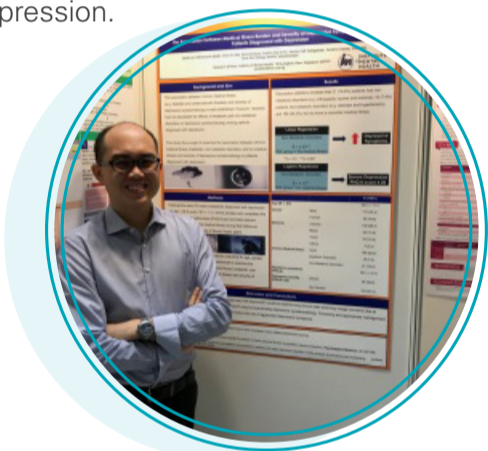


SINGAPORE ALLIED HEALTH AWARDS

Aim of the study: To examine the association of medical illness burden (metabolic disorders, non-metabolic disorders, and no illness) and severity of depressive symptomatology in patients diagnosed with depression.

Abstract Title: Development and Validation of The Chinese Translation of The Positive Mental Health Instrument.

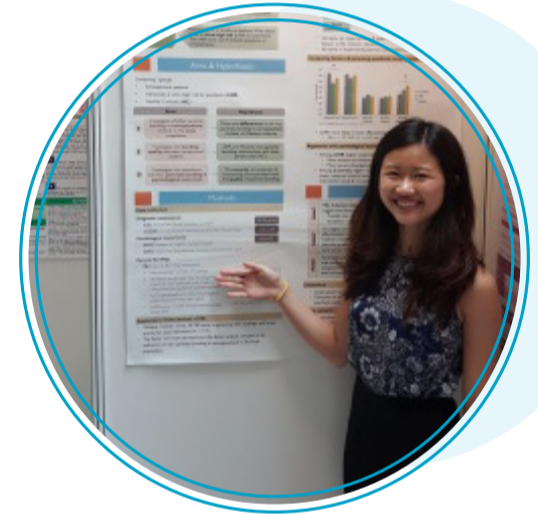
Aim of the study: To develop and validate the Chinese translation of the PMH instrument.

Aim of the study: To investigate the association between the quality of parental bonding and severity of psychotic symptoms.

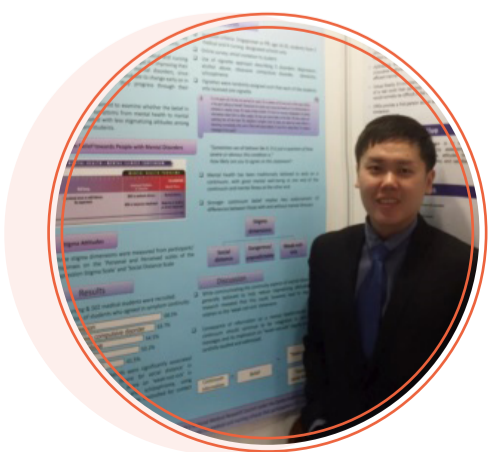

Aim of the study: To look at the relationship between continuum belief and stigmatizing attitudes towards people with mental illnesses in a local healthcare student population.

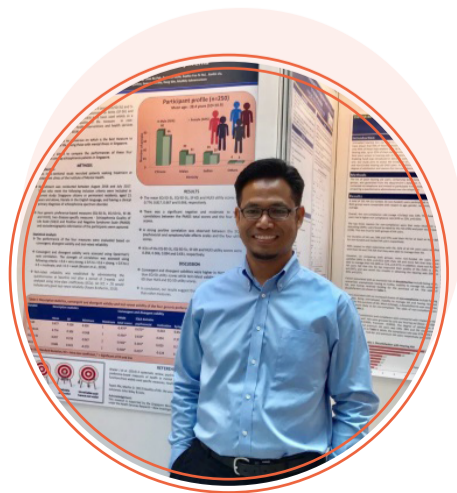
